Hello! I love teaching art, making art, and inspiring kids' creativity.


Things to note about Art class:

 - Model. Show others how to be a good student. Follow school and classroom rules.
- Good art takes time. Students will have art only once every 7 days, so you may not see any art go home for several weeks.

Library

Hello! Mrs. Gafforini and I are very excited to be here at Bailey to work with your child(ren) on library, literacy, and writing skills this year. We will be enjoying a variety of literature, writing, participating in research, learning to use the library catalog and navigate the library, and so much more!

- Every student in 1st grade will be allowed to check out one book per rotation on their reading level.
- Students in grades 2-5 may check out 2 books every rotation. One book must be on their reading level, and one book may be a free choice book on a different level.
- Kindergarten students will check out 1 book to leave at school in their classroom while they learn proper book care and responsibility.

1st-5th grade students must have a completed permission slip prior to your child being allowed to check out from the library. (If you signed a permission slip last year, you do not need to do so again this year.) This is a great opportunity for us to discuss responsibility with the children! Materials must be returned, or paid for if lost or damaged, in order for the student to continue to check out. If a student owes for a book either here at Bailey or at a previous school, a notice is given to teachers to send home. Please help your child take care of these as soon as possible, as we want all our Bailey Broncos to check out and enjoy using their library!
