

How Can I Help My Child with Late Work?

As your child is learning new concepts, completing assignments is an important part of the learning process which helps educators better support student academic growth.



Check the Campus Portal app regularly to monitor your child's grades and look for the Late icon.

What does the Late icon mean?

- Your child did not turn in work by the due date.

What happens when late work is turned in?

- The L will be replaced with a score.
- There is no negative impact on the grade.
- If you see a lot of late assignments, talk to your child about ways to get better at meeting due dates.

What should I do if I see late assignments?

- Help your child make use of supports available at school to complete work not yet submitted.

What if I see a Missing icon and a 50% score?

- Work was not turned in by the extended deadline.
- Your student can no longer turn it in for credit.
- The grade was impacted.



Talk with your child about completing late work in a timely manner in the future.
